Yes, every six months. World acclaimed independent auditors check us against the highest international standards of management. This relates to management in the broadest sense and includes environmental care and social responsibility.

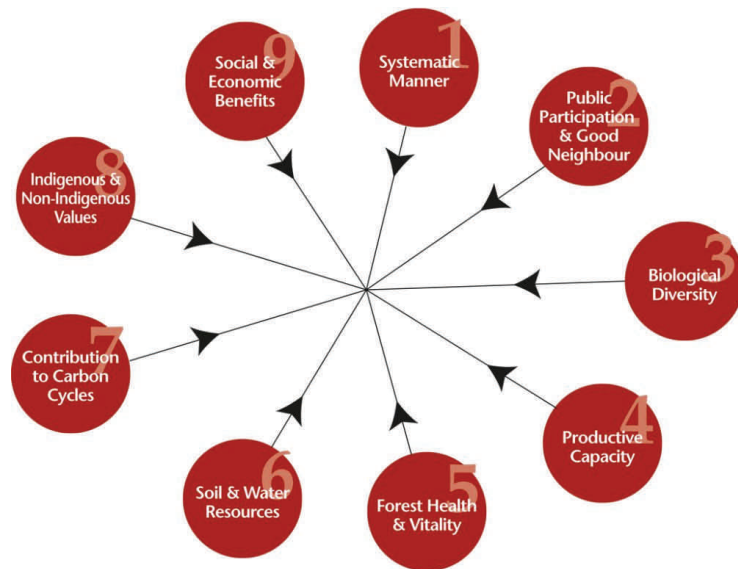
WHERE TO NOW?
